The Department has welcomed the successful establishment of the National Energy Authority (NEA) Audit Committee officially launched on the 28th of May 2025.

This brings the total to 59 Audit committees established in the National Departments, Statutory Bodies and the Provincial Government since the roll out of this program in 2005. For this year three audit committees were launched, Department of Information and Communication Technology, Highlands Regional College of Nursing and the National Energy Authority.

The Audit Committee plays a vital role

in the Government reporting systems of the public sector agencies.

Ensuring good governance and transparency through Public Service Audit Program, proper management, accountability and reporting of public resources. Ensuring that auditors are fully engaged and adding value to the agency operations.

Deputy Secretary Strategy and Governance Dominic Ira while officiating the launch congratulated new authority for successful establishment of this program.

He said, it will provide governance, accountability to the work that the

organisation is carrying out. National Energy Authority which was established 3 years ago has launched this program is a way forward for the organisation.

IFMS cloud migration completes

The Department of Finance has successfully completed migration of Integrated Financial Management System (IFMS) to cloud last month.

As leaders in Public Finance, the Department remains committed in continuously improving financial systems. In today's ever-changing world, we are leveraging the power of cloud technology.

In leading up to the migration, the IFMS team has conducted several awareness workshops with government agencies and stakeholders to fully educated them on the IFMS migration to cloud.

Deputy Secretary Sub-National during an awareness workshop said, time has changed, from Public Government Accounting System to Integrated Financial Management System, embracing technology in migration to cloud is an advantage to system include security features and cost effective measures as well as improving workflow.

The Department is also scaling up Electronic Fund Transaction (EFT), revenue collection in GST s65A and Non tax revenue digitalization.

All Government agencies including National Departments and Trust Entities, Provincial and Local Level Government, District Development Authorities and Statutory Bodies.

The Information Technology Departments for each Government Entities are to allow https://ifmsgovpng. t1cloud.com to pass through their internal IT network. Citrix is still used by all Alesco users. There is no change

in the business process, the change is technical and system feature.

Two months of post implementation and monitoring and review after Golive migration and completes Phase 1 of the project.

Phase 2 is IFMS upgrade that will commence once cloud migration is implemented successfully. Some advantages of the migration include, email capabilities, self-service password, migrated cyber threads. Cost savings and training and test environment available online.

The Department acknowledges all government entities that are using the Integrated Financial Management System and all its stakeholders for the project and will continue to provide support in terms of public finance.
